

NAVAJO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' MINUTES
TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2007

9:00 a.m. Supervisor DeSpain led the Pledge of Allegiance and offered the invocation.

PRESENT: David Tenney, Chairman; J.R. DeSpain, Vice-Chairman; Percy Deal, Supervisor; Jesse Thompson, Supervisor; Jerry Brownlow, Supervisor; Mel Bowers, County Attorney; James Jayne, County Manager; and Darlene Fraley, Clerk of the Board.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC:

- Laree Saline of the Personnel Commission, speaking on behalf of Emery LeBarge, extended a personal invitation to the Stabilization Facilities' celebration scheduled at 11:30 a.m. on November 30, 2007 at the county complex.
- Penny Pew of Congressman Renzi's office announced it is Open Enrollment for Medicare advising their office offers assistance in this effort.
- Chairman Tenney presented a Show Low football jersey to Supervisor Brownlow and a Show Low helmet to Mel Bowers requesting they wear them through the meeting in celebration of Show Low's football victory over Blue Ridge.
- Supervisor Thompson requested the board recognize representatives from the committee for the Dilkon Health Center who then addressed the board discussing progress on this project. They advised that construction should begin during the 2008-2009 fiscal year.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

- a. Presentation of award to Garrett Yazzie in recognition of his innovation in utilizing an alternative energy source: Supervisor Deal introduced Garrett Yazzie's family members who were present in the Chambers and acknowledged Garrett Yazzie's presence by phone. Mrs. Yazzie accepted a plaque in Garrett's honor and expressed her appreciation for what her son accomplished by providing heat for his family. Garrett Yazzie thanked the board for this award and discussed the value he places on education, the benefits to his family and the doors that had been opened for him through this science project. Supervisors expressed their admiration for this science project.
- b. Presentation of plaque to Supervisor DeSpain in recognition of his service as 2007 Arizona Association of Counties' President: Chairman Tenney presented a plaque to Supervisor DeSpain in recognition of his

service, expressing the board's appreciation. Supervisor DeSpain expressed appreciation for the support of the Board, staff and county employees.

- c. Consideration and possible approval of proclamation declaring November 2007 National American Indian Heritage Month: After discussion of the contributions made to this nation by the American Indian, **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to approve a proclamation declaring November 2007 National American Indian Heritage Month; motion seconded by Supervisor Deal; vote unanimous approving the motion.

HUMAN RESOURCES: Consideration and possible approval of Personnel Action report: Gail Calisen reviewed her written report of 55 personnel actions. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to authorize the Chairman to sign the personnel actions as presented; motion seconded by Supervisor DeSpain; vote unanimous approving the motion. James Jayne welcomed Secretary Becky Aldrich to the county and Ms. Aldrich thanked the board for this opportunity.

UNITED WAY: Presentation of United Way efforts in Navajo County explaining how county employees can contribute to the charity of their choice: Lisa Salazar, Director of United Way in Navajo and Apache Counties, discussed the opportunities employees have to make a difference in people's lives through a payroll contribution to United Way. She discussed the 19 partner agencies in Navajo and Apache counties, advising that the employee can designate any 501c3 organization and can also designate contribution through Navajo Way.

NAVAJO COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES DISTRICT: Board of Directors Session: **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to enter into the Navajo County Public Health Services District **Board of Directors Session**; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

- a. Consideration and possible approval of contract HG754060-008, Women's and Children's Health Grant/Amendment 1: Amy Stradling reviewed the contract as listed advising it has been in place since 2004, responding to questions from the supervisors. **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to approve contract HG754060-008, Women's and Children's Health Grant/Amendment 1; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion with Supervisor Thompson absent for the vote.
- b. Information regarding the distribution of the NACo Discount Prescription Drug Program cards to all county residents: Mary Tyler discussed the NACo Discount Prescription Drug Program that is going live this week, providing an avenue for any county resident to receive discounted prescriptions as needed. She will be available as a resource regarding the program for any needing information.

Supervisor DeSpain made a motion to return to regular session; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: Consideration and possible approval of Central Navajo County Community Wildfire Protection Plan Grant No. WWWP02 with the Office of the State Forester and Designation of Navajo County Emergency Management as the funds coordinating agency: Tim Zaremba advised this grant is funded by the Bureau of Land Management in the amount \$25,000, Navajo County has committed \$5,000 and the Town of Taylor has contributed \$5,000 for a total of \$35,000 and reported the coordinator will be Steve Campbell. **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to approve the item as presented; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow. Following some discussion the vote was unanimous approving the motion.

SHERIFF: Consideration and possible approval of Resolution Number _____ - 07 authorizing application to Arizona State Parks, Law Enforcement Boating and Safety Fund and authorizing Sheriff Butler to act on behalf

of Navajo County in conducting all negotiations related to the LEBSF project for FY 08/09: Chief Bernard Huser reviewed the grant as submitted. **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to approve **Resolution Number 87 - 07** authorizing application to Arizona State Parks, Law Enforcement Boating and Safety Fund and authorizing Sheriff Butler to act on behalf of Navajo County in conducting all negotiations related to the LEBSF project for FY 08/09; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

ELECTIONS: Consideration and possible acceptance of Canvass of Official Results of the Joseph City Unified School District #2 Bond Election, Whiteriver Unified School District #10 K-3 Override, and Kayenta Unified School District #27 Maintenance and Operations' Override, K-3 Override and Capital Outlay Override conducted on November 6, 2007: Lisa McKee read the canvass of the election showing that all bond and budget elections passed. **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to approve the canvass of the vote as presented; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion. Note: The canvass is available for review in the Elections' office.

FINANCE/PURCHASING:

- a. Presentation of the published Navajo County FY2008 budget document and timeline for the FY2009 budget: James Menlove distributed the budget report and discussed specific portions of it. Supervisors thanked Mr. Menlove for his leadership in completing audits and Mr. Menlove thanked his staff for their contributions.
- b. Presentation of the published Navajo County FY2005 Audited Financial Statements: James Menlove introduced Dennis Miller, financial consultant, and representatives of the Auditor General's Financial Audit Division. Dennis Mathiesson, Director of the Financial Audit Division, distributed the audited FY05 financial report, advising the County was financially sound in that year. He discussed the history of many years when the county was not audited and then the negative impact when GASB rules changed, which was touted as the largest change in governmental reporting in 100 years. He expressed appreciation for the county's willingness to accept assistance in catching up the audits and the Auditor General's willingness to partner with the county to assure this happens. He advised they are pleased with the progress the county has made and that 2006 is expected to be completed soon. James Menlove, James Jayne and Supervisors expressed appreciation to Auditor General Davenport and her staff for their assistance and for their presence here today.
- c. Consideration and possible authorization for Finance/Purchasing to sell at public auction four parcels located on Oval Drive in Overgaard: APN 206-17-111; 206-17-102; 206-17-016; and 206-17-049: Mary Springer advised these parcels are in a residential area and that the property was deeded to the county several years ago. She stated that after careful consideration, it was determined it is best to offer this property at public auction and that Lance Payette advised it has to be offered at 90% of appraised value. She stated she would like to conduct a live public auction at a future board meeting. **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to authorize Finance/Purchasing to sell at public auction four parcels located on Oval Drive in Overgaard: APN 206-17-111; 206-17-102; 206-17-016; and 206-17-049; motion seconded by Supervisor Deal; vote unanimous approving the motion. James Jayne stated the money will be reinvested in the Heber Overgaard community in the Mogollon Complex.
- d. Consideration and possible award of contract for RFP B07-060-010 to Colorado Customware for parcel management software and implementation: Mary Springer advised this is a web based management program that would provide parcel management for the Assessor. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to award the contract for RFP B07-060-010 to Colorado Customware for parcel management software and implementation; motion seconded by Supervisor DeSpain. Following discussion, the vote was unanimous approving the motion.
- e. Consideration and possible award of three contracts to Frontier Communications for Internet service for

Holbrook and Show Low locations per RFP B07-020-012: Mary Springer advised this plan includes planning for future needs and she and James Jayne responded to questions regarding this award. **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to award contracts to Frontier Communications for Internet service for Holbrook and Show Low locations per RFP B07-020-012; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; Following discussion, the vote was unanimous approving the motion.

- f. Consideration and possible award of contract to Jim Brown and Sons Roofing in the amount of \$92,329.27 to repair Sheriff's office roof: Mary Springer advised this contractor is a State contract bidder and that while purchasing did not put this contract out to bid other roofers looked at the project to assure the award is competitive. Following some discussion where questions were answered, **Supervisor Brownlow made a motion** to award a contract to Jim Brown and Sons Roofing in the amount of \$92,329.27 to repair the Sheriff's office roof; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.
- g. Community Development Block Grant
- i. Update on CDBG funding in Navajo County: Randy Sullivan provided information regarding progress on CDBG projects, advising that four of the projects were denied due to being on reservation lands. He stated the other five projects were coming back for more qualifications but the applicants were given a pre-award letter. He further advised that because four projects were denied they will change the scope on the other five and include administration costs in the revised scope. He advised the scope of the fairgrounds project will be changed to pave the midway and provide handicap accessibility and that the Chairman will sign these revised scopes. Supervisor Thompson thanked Mary Springer, Rod Ross and Randy Sullivan for participating with him in a meeting with Fred Karges, Director, and other staff of the Department of Housing where it was explained that while these funds could not go on the reservation, they will work to identify other funds that can assist. Supervisors requested an itemized list of all projects that would move forward and discussed the impact of the new policy interpretation. Supervisor Deal expressed extreme disappointment in this interpretation and discussed the negative impact it will have on county residents in his district and their trust of government. He discussed the great need for this housing rehabilitation to bring running water and electricity into homes. Supervisor Deal requested that administration and the board consider the alternative by utilizing county money and other grant money to finish what was started as a CDBG project, rather than saying the project can not continue.
- ii. Consideration and possible approval of a letter regarding recent funding decisions impacting Navajo County reservation residents: **Supervisor Deal made a motion** to approve the letter regarding recent funding decisions impacting Navajo County reservation residents; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson. Rod Ross reviewed the letter that stated many reservation residents were disenfranchised by this ruling and requesting the initiation of a dialogue with HUD to allow this funding source to be restored. Following further discussion, the vote was unanimous approving the motion.

PUBLIC WORKS:

- a. North Whistle Stop Loop Improvement District: Carol Fraley provided a map of the area within the Whistle Stop Loop Improvement District stating she has not received written objections to this project and the verified petition contains 68.6% of property owners signing in favor and 66.3% of the acreage represented by signatures. Dusty Parsons stated they did receive one call in opposition and that party was going to email their opposition but did not do so.
- i. **PUBLIC HEARING:** Formation of North Whistle Stop Loop Improvement District: Supervisor Tenney invited public comment and there was none and he closed the public hearing.
- ii. Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution _____ - 07 to establish the North Whistle Stop Loop Improvement District of Navajo County: **Supervisor Brownlow made a motion** to adopt **Resolution 88 - 07** to establish the North Whistle Stop Loop Improvement District of Navajo County; motion seconded by Supervisor DeSpain; vote unanimous approving the motion.
- b. Consideration and possible award of Contract #B07-09-010 to purchase one or more Variable Horsepower

Tandem Drive Motor Grader to RDO Equipment in the amount of \$167,500.00 not including applicable taxes: Dusty Parsons reviewed this request. **Supervisor Brownlow made a motion** to award Contract #B07-09-010 to purchase one or more variable horsepower tandem drive motor grader to RDO Equipment in the amount of \$167,500.00 not including applicable taxes; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

- c. Consideration and possible award of Contract #B07-09-018 to purchase one or more D6Dozer of Equivalent to Empire Machinery in the amount of \$313,008.95: Dusty Parsons reviewed this request that came in under budget. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to approve the award of Contract #B07-09-018 to purchase one or more D6Dozers or equivalent to Empire Machinery in the amount of \$313,008.95; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

BOARD BUSINESS: Supervisors reported on activities within their districts and events they had participated in; expressed appreciation to Laurie Frost, Tad Spader, Dr. Kartchner, Rosie Sekayumtewa, Dusty Parsons and James Jayne for meeting with the Dilkon Health Steering Committee to help find alternative ways to fund that facility; thanked Supervisor DeSpain for his leadership at AACo; and discussed the impact the budget cuts will have on Navajo County. Supervisor DeSpain discussed the impact of the court ordered closing of US plants where horses were killed stating there is now no avenue in the US to dispose of horses. Supervisor Deal reported the success of the mass vaccination at Hardrock yesterday and thanked county staff for their participation. Everyone was wished a Happy Thanksgiving.

ADJOURN At 12:09 p.m., **Supervisor DeSpain made a motion** to adjourn; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.
