

**NAVAJO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**  
**TUESDAY, JUNE 3, 2008**

**9:00 a.m. Call to Order:** Chairman DeSpain led the Pledge of Allegiance and offered the invocation.

**PRESENT:** J. R. DeSpain, Chairman; Jerry Brownlow, Vice-Chairman; Jesse Thompson, Supervisor; Darlene Fraley, Clerk of the Board. David Tenney, Supervisor; Mel Bowers, County Attorney; and James Jayne, County Manager, joined the meeting in progress. Percy Deal, Supervisor, was unable to attend.

**CALL TO THE PUBLIC:** No response

**CONSENT AGENDA:** a) Vouchers—April; b) Warrants over \$1,000—April; c) Letter of support for Show Low Regional Airport air service marketing grant; d) Letter of sympathy for Steve Ebert and Brent Brown's family; e) Agreement between Arizona State Forestry Division and the Navajo County Board of Supervisors regarding Environmental Program Assistance; f) Minutes—May 6, 2008; g) Constable Reports: Holbrook #1 April; Winslow #2 April; Snowflake #3 April; Kayenta #4 April; Show Low #5 April; Pinetop #6 April; h) Justice Court Reports: Kayenta #4 April: **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to approve the Consent Agenda as presented and authorize the Chairman to sign the documents; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion with Supervisor Tenney absent for the vote.

**NAVAJO COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES DISTRICT Board of Directors Session:** **Supervisor Brownlow made a motion** to enter into the Navajo County Public Health Services District **Board of Directors' Session**; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion with Supervisor Tenney absent for the vote.

- a. Consideration and possible approval of professional services agreement between Navajo County Public Health Services District and Larson Waste, Inc. for medical waste pick up and disposal effective 6/1/08: Mary Tyler reviewed this professional services agreement stating this is a new contract containing standard terms. In response to a question from Chairman DeSpain, Ms. Tyler stated the amount of waste varies, such as during the flu vaccine time. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to approve the professional services agreement between Navajo County Public Health Services District and Larson Waste, Inc. for medical waste pick up and disposal effective 6/1/08; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion with Supervisor Tenney absent for the vote.
- b. Consideration and possible approval of professional services agreement between Navajo County Public Health Services District and Connie Baine, Registered Dental Hygienist to complete services for the Oral Health Community Development contract with the Arizona Department of Health Services from June 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008: Ms. Tyler advised the board this is a new agreement. Supervisor David Tenney, Mel Bowers, County Attorney, and James Jayne, County Manager, joined the meeting at this time. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to approve the contract as presented; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

**Supervisor Brownlow made a motion** to return to regular session; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

**BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

- a. Quality Emulsions and Navajo County Recognizing Excellence: Supervisors presented certificates and fruit baskets as sponsored by Quality Emulsions to Cris Parisot of Finance and Kirk Grugel of CASA for their outstanding contributions to their departments and county operations.
- b. Personnel service awards: Supervisors presented service award pins to Howard Hamilton—5 years; Vicky Nalty—10 years; and Perry Denton—15 years.

**HUMAN RESOURCES:**

- a. Consideration and possible approval of Personnel Action report: Gail Calisen reviewed her 36 item written report. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to approve the Personnel Action report and authorize the Chairman to sign that document; motion seconded by Supervisor Tenney; vote unanimous approving the motion.
- b. Consideration and possible approval of:
  - i. Reclassification of the vacant Deputy Finance Director – Accounting position to Assistant County Manager: Ms. Calisen stated that since the Assistant County Manager will be the second highest position in the county, this item is being brought forward separately from the normal personnel action report. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to reclassify the vacant Deputy Finance Director – Accounting position to Assistant County Manager; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.
  - ii. Job description of Assistant County Manager and assigned salary range: Ms. Calisen reviewed the proposed job description, stating the salary range for the position is 74, \$91,793 to \$114,742. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to approve the proposed job description and assigned salary range of 74; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.
  - iii. Recruitment for the position: Ms. Calisen advised recruitment would begin utilizing the job description that was just approved. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to start in-county recruitment for the position; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson. Mr. Bowers inquired if the county wide recommendation came from Ms. Calisen and she stated it is her recommendation; that there are in-county personnel who have the wide range of experience required for this position and if that recruitment is not successful, going outside is still an option. Supervisor Tenney stated that whether it is the Assessor, Sheriff or other department, he believes there is sufficient talent within the county to name a deputy and that the board has not set a policy dictating departments had to recruit either outside or within the county. Supervisor Thompson concurred, pointing out it has always been a preference to hire quality administrative staff in the county if it is possible and he believes administration will inform the board if it is difficult to recruit a candidate from within. Supervisor Brownlow inquired if the board will be involved in those interviews also and Mr. Jayne stated that in recent hirings administration has brought forth a recommendation to the board and it is the intent to bring a recommendation to the June 17<sup>th</sup> meeting. Vote unanimous approving the motion. Mel Bowers inquired if additional dollars would have to be included to accommodate the difference for the Deputy Finance Director Range as opposed to the Assistant Manager position. James Jayne stated the dollars in the administration budget is a zero dollar increase. Supervisor Tenney clarified that since this position pays more than the assistant finance director, that allowance would have to be made in the budget just as other departments increased in some areas and reduced in some areas. Vote unanimous approving the motion.

**FINANCE/PURCHASING:**

- a. Consideration and possible authorization award of contract for Global Positioning System for Advance Vehicle Location Systems to provide accurate Sheriff Office vehicle locations to Creative Communications Sales & Rental, Inc., per B08-05-005: Mary Springer advised since this bid was conducted staff has been made aware of a better product. At her request the item was pulled.
- b. Consideration and possible authorization for Finance/Purchasing to conduct internet public auctions for surplus equipment and approval of auction schedule for fiscal year 2008/09: Mary Springer reviewed this request with auctions scheduled September/October 2008; December/January 2009; March/April 2009; and June 2009. Chairman DeSpain inquired if there are any difficulties with internet auctions and Ms. Springer stated the only negative experience is when people have bid on vehicles and then renege. She stated when that happens that person is taken off future bid lists and the

vehicle is offered to the next highest bidder. Mr. Bowers discussed an issue that arose with Rolex watches stating they now typically toss those watches as they are usually knock-offs. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to authorize Finance/Purchasing to conduct internet public auctions for surplus equipment and approve the auction schedule for fiscal year 2008/09; motion seconded by Supervisor Tenney; vote unanimous approving the motion.

- c. Consideration and possible approval of Resolution \_\_\_\_\_ - 08 for a lease agreement between Navajo County and City of Holbrook for lease of the Old Navajo County Courthouse: Mary Springer reviewed this request. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to approve **Resolution Number 36 - 08** for a lease agreement between Navajo County and the City of Holbrook for lease of the property known as the Old Navajo County Courthouse; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson. Chairman DeSpain discussed differences between this lease and the last advising the county partners more within the proposed lease. Vote unanimous approving the motion.
- d. Consideration and possible approval of termination of contract for vehicle purchase with Winslow Ford (B07-010-024): Mary Springer stated the vendor found this award was not advantageous to the vendor and the county is not buying these vehicles this year. **Supervisor Brownlow made a motion** to terminate this contract; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion. In response to a question from Supervisor Tenney, Ms. Springer stated that Lance Payette advised that board action to terminate the contract at the vendor's request is the appropriate action.
- e. Consideration and possible award of three year contract B08-001-008 with two one-year renewal periods for Wide Area Network to Frontier Communications: Mary Springer reviewed this request. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to approve the award of a three year contract B08-001-008 with two one-year renewal periods for Wide Area Network to Frontier Communications; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

Chairman DeSpain recognized Mayor Jeff Hill and his son in the audience and Supervisor Thompson acknowledged the presence of Franklin Gishi.

### **PUBLIC WORKS:**

- a. Consideration and possible approval of Resolution Number \_\_\_\_\_ - 08 accepting a portion of Bonito Drive and McGihom Road and all of Supancheck Road and Trails End into the County road maintenance system: Carol Fraley reported these roads have been completed to county standards and staff recommends acceptance. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to adopt **Resolution Number 37-08** accepting a portion of Bonito Drive and McGihom Road and all of Supancheck Road and Trails End into the County road maintenance system; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous with Chairman DeSpain absent for the vote.
- b. Consideration and possible approval of Resolution Number \_\_\_\_\_ - 08 adding the Starlight Ridge Estates Unit 2 roads into the Navajo County Maintenance System to include portions of Draco Drive, Carina Lane, Andromeda Way, Luminary Way, Rim Road, Orion Drive, Gemini Lane, Taurus Drive and Webb Drive: Carol Fraley reported these roads have been completed to county standards and staff recommends acceptance. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to adopt **Resolution Number 38 - 08** adding the Starlight Ridge Estates Unit 2 roads into the Navajo County Maintenance System to include portions of Draco Drive, Carina Lane, Andromeda Way, Luminary Way, Rim Road, Orion Drive, Gemini Lane, Taurus Drive and Webb Drive; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.
- c. Victory Heights Maintenance District Board of Directors' Session: Consideration and possible approval of Victory Heights Maintenance District expenditure of funds of over \$1,000: **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to enter into the Victory Heights Maintenance District **Board of Directors' Session**; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion with Chairman DeSpain absent for the vote. Carol Fraley reviewed this request and **Supervisor Tenney**

**made a motion** to approve Victory Heights Maintenance District expenditure of funds of over \$1,000; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to return to regular session; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

- d. Consideration and possible approval of amendment to the Hauling Waste Tire Contract with Crumb Rubber Manufacturer: Dusty Parson discussed the value of this program to the county, stating staff anticipates the program operating in the black. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to approve the amendment to the Hauling Waste Tire Contract with Crumb Rubber Manufacturer to increase the price per ton as per presented bid tab and extend the contract an additional year through June 18, 2009; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.
- e. Consideration and possible approval of amendment to the Pavement Markings Contract #B07-04-012 with United Rentals Highway Technologies, Inc. to extend it through June 18, 2009: Following review of this request by Dusty Parsons, **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to approve the presented amendment to the Pavement Markings Contract #B07-04-012 with United Rentals Highway Technologies, Inc. to extend it through June 18, 2009; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.
- f. Consideration and possible approval of amendment one of the design-build contract (second step) with Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc. for completion of the construction services for Porter Mountain Road, Contract Number B06-10-018 for a guaranteed maximum price of \$2,518,365.70: Mr. Parsons verified this price is a not-to-exceed amount and that the road is in District IV. Supervisor Tenney commended staff on engineering estimates coming in lower than anticipated. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to approve amendment one of the design-build contract with Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc. for completion of the construction services for Porter Mountain Road, Contract Number B06-10-018 for a guaranteed maximum price of \$2,518,365.70; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.
- g. Consideration and possible approval of the purchase of two vans for the Loma Puh Tah' Vi programs in Holbrook and Winslow (Na'Nizhoozhi Center, Inc.) with funding of \$27,163.20 to come from District II LTAF II funds and \$27,163.20 to come from District III LTAF II funds: Dusty Parsons reviewed this request for funding of vans for the new stabilization centers in the Holbrook and Winslow areas. Supervisor Thompson thanked the board and administration for support in purchasing these two vans. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to approve the purchase of two vans for the Loma Puh Tah' Vi programs in Holbrook and Winslow (Na'Nizhoozhi Center, Inc.) with funding of \$27,163.20 to come from District II LTAF II funds and \$27,163.20 to come from District III LTAF II funds; motion seconded by Supervisor Tenney; vote unanimous approving the motion. Supervisor Thompson clarified these vans can be retrofitted for ADA compliance and both Chairman DeSpain and Supervisor Thompson requested notification when these vans arrive.
- h. **PUBLIC HEARING:** Consideration and possible approval by Resolution Number - 08 of a Special Use Permit request by SemStream, L.P., to develop a propane/butane distribution terminal for storage of propane, on the subject parcel 103-18-001J in the Winslow area: Linda Elliott reviewed this request orienting the board to the site, advised of a favorable staff report, reported that no flood plain restrictions apply and advised that Planning and Zoning Commission condition recommendations are outlined in the resolution. Mr. Fraley stated that the City of Winslow's requested conditions have also been incorporated. Chairman DeSpain opened the public hearing. The developer, Mr. Jim Asbury of Tulsa, OK, discussed the history of his businesses in Arizona and stated he is requesting to build a terminal for distribution of propane/butane that will serve these businesses and other wholesalers in northern Arizona. He reported he has gone through the permitting process with Planning and Zoning, met with the City of Winslow, filed with the State Fire Marshall, followed OSHA and EPA guidelines, and will meet with ADOT on the entrance road. He reported that most steps taken are at the direction of

Planning and Zoning staff and also following the design required for use within the industry. He advised the propane distribution is by transport trucks with about half going south on SR 87 and the other traffic would be on I-40, thus directing traffic away from the residential areas. He reviewed placement on the property as related to the roads and stated the appropriate protection is in place for emergency shut downs. In response to a question from Chairman DeSpain, Mr. Asbury again showed the placement of the tanks discussing fencing that is in place and a planned 6' high security fence that is a keypad entry. He stated he will work with other property owners and emergency services for access to the property as the keypad entry is the main entry. Supervisor Thompson advised that he had been approached with concerns about truck traffic through residential areas and Mr. Fraley reviewed the access that would minimize traffic through residential areas. No other audience members spoke to this issue and the Chairman closed the public hearing. **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to adopt **Resolution Number 39 - 08** approving a Special Use Permit request by SemStream, L.P., to develop a propane/butane distribution terminal for storage of propane, on the subject parcel 103-18-001J in the Winslow area; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

- i. **PUBLIC HEARING: Consideration and possible approval by Resolution Number \_\_\_\_\_ - 08 of a zone change request by Maria S. Romo and agent Dale Kuhlman from RU-20 zoning classification to CR zoning classification to allow for a wildlife artistry (taxidermy) procedures and techniques training facility on the northerly 337.08 feet (5 acres) of APN 403-21-003A in the Snowflake area:** Linda Elliott reviewed this zoning request to allow for a wildlife artistry facility on the northerly 5 acres of the 20 acre parcel. She oriented the board to the property, stating it is surrounded by a fence, is 0.7 miles from a country store that is also commercial, the property is now vacant land, and stating students will attend classes to learn this craft. She reviewed all requested uses advising that for uses other than those requested the owner would have to apply for a special use permit. She pointed out that two of the four adjacent property owners are against the zone changes orienting the board to the location of their properties in relation to the subject property. She stated this action received a 4-2 recommendation for approval by the Planning & Zoning Commission. Mr. Fraley stated that a Cedar Hills group spoke at the Planning and Zoning Commission and their letters were included in the board packet. Chairman DeSpain opened the public hearing. Dale Kuhlman of Gilbert stated he is the owner of the property, he teaches at a taxidermy school in Wyoming and there are no other taxidermy schools in the southwest. He stated the students are in the area for nine weeks, contributing to the economy of the area and participating in community events. He oriented the board to the location of the buildings, placed to minimize the traffic on Concho Road. He reported he does not handle blood letting here as the products used for training are already processed. Lisa Marshall of 8887 Concho Highway and Teresa Rogers of 96 Sharp Trail spoke in favor of this action. With no one speaking opposed to the action, the Chairman closed the public hearing. Ms. Elliott advised the board of a clerical error correction on the resolution. Chairman DeSpain stated he spoke with area residents about this issue who had concerns about the business but after further discussion they felt their concerns were addressed as long as animals will not be killed or skinned on the premises. In response to a question from Supervisor Tenney regarding why the depth is 337 feet as opposed to the 300' that is the normal commercial strip, Mr. Fraley advised this had been done to make the parcel exactly five acres. During discussion, it was determined that the hotel/motel provision would be removed and Mr. Kuhlman agreed this was acceptable. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to approve **Resolution Number 40 - 08** of a zone change request by Maria S. Romo and agent Dale Kuhlman from RU-20 zoning classification to CR zoning classification to allow for a wildlife artistry (taxidermy) procedures and techniques training facility on the northerly 300 feet of APN 403-21-003A in the Snowflake area disallowing the hotel/motel use; motion seconded by Supervisor Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

City of Holbrook for lease of the Old Navajo County Courthouse: James Jayne requested the board revisit this item. He clarified an earlier version of the lease agreement was inadvertently included with the board packet on this item and the correct copy was distributed that reflects that a portion of item 8 should read "...that any structural or mechanical repairs requiring an out-of-pocket expenditure of \$5,000 or more shall be mutually agreed upon by Lessor and Lessee, and the cost thereof shall be divided equally between Lessor and Lessee." He stated that item 17 must include a reference to the annex. **Supervisor Tenney made a motion** to acknowledge the lease in the original packet was the incorrect version and to acknowledge by approving **Resolution Number 36-08** the presented lease is now the correct one; motion seconded by Supervisor Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

**BOARD BUSINESS**—Supervisors discussed meetings impacting the county that they had attended or planned to attend including Supervisor Tenney and other county supervisors meeting with Corbin Newman, Regional Forester, where Supervisor Tenney did not feel they received the answers they wanted on travel management and the stewardship to include opening up enough forest acreage for projects like the Winslow OSB plant; Supervisor Thompson and Supervisor Deal discussed the recent conference sponsored by the Tomhave Group with lots of participation from Apache and Navajo counties, San Juan County UT, BIA transportation from Tuba City, Navajo Nation, NDOT, and public schools; Supervisor Brownlow met with Chairman Lupe of the White Mountain Apache Tribe who would like to address the board in the future. Chairman DeSpain requested that the Tomhave Group provide a future presentation to the whole board. Mr. Jayne distributed a full page article of an interview with Supervisor Tenney and his son, Stetson, who plays for BYU.

**ADJOURN:** At 11:17 a.m., **Supervisor Thompson made a motion** to adjourn; motion seconded by Supervisor Tenney; vote unanimous approving the motion.
